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# Objective:

As many students as you wish may work together to create the service project newsletter. Students will create a one page newsletter with article(s) detailing all the activities their chapter has completed for the chapter's selected service project for the year.

#### Method of creation:

Any desktop publishing software or word processing software. Finished product should saved as a **.pdf file** and be the equivalent of 1 printed 8 ½" x 11" page. (Article should follow a newsletter format, either 2 or 3 columns).

## Product should include:

The newsletter should

- 1. Be formatted in newsletter style
  - a. 2 or 3 column format
  - b. Pictures with captions
  - c. Visually appealing graphical elements
  - d. Headline
- 2. Article(s) adequately addresses the 5 W's (who, what, when, where and how) and be written in journalistic style (not narrative). Article text style would be suitable for a press release to local newspaper.
- 3. Include description of the event(s) the chapter sponsored throughout the year in support of the service organization.
- 4. Include dates and pictures of the sponsored event(s)



- 5. State the total amount the Tome Chapter raised for the service organization during the current school year and/OR the total number of hours your Tome Chapter students contributed to the organization in active service hours.
- 6. Include why the specific service organization was selected by the chapter and the relationship to Tome Society (explain one or more of the deciding factors below):
  - a. how the goals of the service organization relate to one or more Tome Society "It" list books OR
  - b. how the service organization promotes literacy OR
  - c. how the service organization supports one or more of the character goals of the Tome Society "It" list
    - i. "We believe teenagers should be encouraged ...to rise above discouraging situations and cycles of destructive behavior; to make a difference in the world around them; to look beyond themselves and reflect on how their personal decisions will impact present and future generations."

## Method of Submission:

Advisers will submit entries through the online Spring Adviser Competition Entry Form. Directions to submit will be emailed to paid chapter advisers prior to the deadline.

All entries must be submitted by: No later than the posted Spring Competition deadline found at tomesociety.org/competitions - Entries must be submitted by the Chapter Adviser -- only 1 entry per chapter (3-5), (6-8) and (9-12)

### Lesson Plan for ELA Teachers

Subject Area: English/Language Arts

Grade Level: 4th- 5th or 6th- 8th or 9th-12th

Time: At least one class period to create the article as well as time outside of class as necessary

#### Standards:

- <u>CCSS.ELA-Literacy.CCRA.W.5</u> Develop and strengthen writing as needed by planning, revising, editing, rewriting, or trying a new approach.
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#### Overview:

By applying visual learning techniques and reading comprehension, students will be able to better understand and describe central ideas or themes and summarize key ideas in a text as well as present these understandings.

#### Extended Lesson:

#### Lesson:

After completing the extended lesson:

- 1. Show the students the different aspects of the article including the **Rubric**.
- 2. Allow students the rest of the class period to begin the initial work on their articles and inform students to work on their articles outside of class as necessary.
- 3. Optional: Have students present articles to the class or print the articles and hang in the classrooms.
- 4. Submit the best article to the Tome Society competition in Edmodo.
