

Digital Graphic Cover Redesign Competition

Instructions to Compete

Individual Event	Limit 1 entry per chapter

Objective:

Students will redesign the cover of any fiction book they have personally read. Students will use elements from the story (theme, style, tone, and/or setting) to inspire their creation of a new cover for the book. The redesign will be a digital graphic redesign using a program such as Photoshop.

Anchor Standards:

 CCSS.ELA-Literacy.CCRA.SL.5 Make strategic use of digital media and visual displays of data to express information and enhance understanding of presentations.

Method of creation:

Students can use any digital graphic design program (ex. Photoshop, Illustrator, etc.). All entries must be totally and completely the original work of the student (no stock images or clip art).

Guidelines:

- 1. Should be a redesign of the cover of a book that the student has read.
- 2. Should include the title of the book somewhere on the image.
- 3. Should be original digital graphic design created by the student (not hand drawn)
- 4. Should not include any copyrighted material.
- 5. School appropriate images (no nudity, etc.).
- 6. Not a team competition.
- 7. Final product should be in color and submitted as a .jpg or .png file.

Submission limitations:

Individual event. Each chapter is allowed to submit 1 entry.

Product should include in any order:

- 1. 3 pages including the following.
 - a. Page 1
 - i. Title of book and author of the represented.
 - ii. Picture of the original cover of the book
 - b. Page 2
 - A student's artistic representation of a redesigned cover of the book. (All the student's own original work (no stock images or clip art)
 - c. Page 3
 - i. A 200-400 word explanation of how the student's redesigned cover is a representation of the overall book. Explanation paragraph should include how the new cover include aspects relevant to the content of the book (including theme, style, tone and/or setting with cited evidence from the book text.)

Method of Submission:
Judged product must be a high-quality PDF file with
clear images. Advisers will submit entries through the
online Spring Adviser Competition Entry Form. Specific
directions will be emailed to advisers closer to the
submission date.
All entries must be submitted by:
The posted competition deadline. Entries must be
submitted by the Chapter Adviser to the Spring Adviser
Competition Entry Form only 1 entry per chapter/level

Classroom Lesson Plan

Unit:

Tome Society

Unit Objective:

Students will redesign the cover of a book that they have personally read.

Anchor Standards:

• CCSS.ELA-Literacy.CCRA.SL.5 Make strategic use of digital media and visual displays of data to express information and enhance understanding of presentations.

Lesson:

Create an original redesign of a cover of a book using a digital graphic design program such as Photoshop or Illustrator.

Lesson Objective:

Students will redesign the cover of one book that they have personally read.

Tools/Equipment Needed:

Computer (desktop or laptop)

Digital graphic design software (ex. Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, Canva, CorelDraw, InkScape, inDesign)

Links to Prior Knowledge/Activities:

Students will have already read their chosen book and participated in a discussion about the elements of the story (theme, tone, style).

Lesson Activities:

- 1. The teacher will provide instructions on how to create a digital graphic cover redesign and give students the guidelines concerning their art piece. The teacher will then provide a clear example of what an appropriate cover redesign looks like while highlighting exactly which items each student should include. The teacher will also take time to review the rubric in which the students will be graded.
- 2. Students will then have opportunities, both in class and outside of class to complete their assignment. The teacher, other students, and discussion boards will be able to assist and guide students with their cover redesign.
- 3. Students will submit their final project which will be graded both by their teacher and by the judges of the Tome Society Digital Graphic Cover Redesign competition, using a rubric.

Assessment

The students' cover redesign will be graded according to a rubric and the finished product will serve as the assessment.
